### **Who is it for?**

This week of events is open to anyone and everyone, whether of any faith or no faith. All are welcome.

### **Do I need to book?**

There is no booking for these talks. Do just turn up on the day.

### **How many sessions can I come to?**

As many as you like! So do come to one of the ones early in the week if you can. If you like it you may want to come back to all the others! The sessions will be different on different days.

### **What is the format of the sessions?**

In the first half of each session (whether lunchtime or evening) Roger Carswell will interview our special guest for that day. In the second half Roger will give a simple and engaging explanation of an aspect of the Christian message.

### **Will there be food?**

Drinks and nibbles will be served at the evening events but not food, so please do aim to eat beforehand. The start-time for the evening events is designed to give time for that after work.

### **How much will it cost?**

Admission to all events is FREE of charge. (If anyone wanted to make a donation to the Barge we wouldn't refuse given it has cost some £4000 to put on this week, but there is no obligation whatsoever!)

### **What is the difference between the lunchtime and evening sessions?**

The lunchtime sessions are just 40 minutes long, whereas the evening sessions are 1 ½ hours. This means that the evening sessions will provide more time to get to know the speakers better and to hear about their experiences in more detail. You could come to a lunchtime session as a taster and then return in the evening to hear more!

### **Will I be asked to do anything?**

No. You are just invited to sit and listen. There is no audience participation (eg. singing).
