Introduction

- if God already knows, why pray?

1. God is absolutely sovereign

- all knowing (Prov 16:33, Matt 6:8)
- all powerful (Ps 115:3, Prov 16:4)
- has a plan for the world (Eph 1:11)

2. We have a responsibility to pray

- we are commanded to pray (Matt 26:41)
- we pray to develop our relationship with God (John 1:12)
- we do not have because we do not ask (James 4:2, Luke 11:9, James 5:16-17)

3. God has chosen to use our prayers as part of his plans

- prayer turns aside God's anger (Ex 32)
- prayer leads to revival (2 Chron 7:14)
- prayer leads to personal forgiveness (1 John 1:9)
- prayer activates an angelic response (Dan 9:23)
- prayer gives us boldness in evangelism (Acts 4:29, 31)
- prayer leads to miraculous deliverance for God's servants (Acts 12)
