

Hebrews 1:5-14

- ⁵ For to which of the angels did God ever say,
“You are my Son, today I have begotten you”?
Or again,
“I will be to him a father, and he shall be to me a son”?
⁶ And again, when he brings the firstborn into the world, he says,
“Let all God's angels worship him.”
⁷ Of the angels he says,
“He makes his angels winds, and his ministers a flame of fire.”
⁸ But of the Son he says,
“Your throne, O God, is for ever and ever, the sceptre of uprightness is the sceptre of your kingdom. ⁹ You have loved righteousness and hated wickedness; therefore God, your God, has anointed you with the oil of gladness beyond your companions.”
¹⁰ And,
“You, Lord, laid the foundation of the earth in the beginning, and the heavens are the work of your hands; ¹¹ they will perish, but you remain; they will all wear out like a garment, ¹² like a robe you will roll them up, like a garment they will be changed. But you are the same, and your years will have no end.”
¹³ And to which of the angels has he ever said,
“Sit at my right hand until I make your enemies a footstool for your feet”?
¹⁴ Are they not all ministering spirits sent out to serve for the sake of those who are to inherit salvation?
