

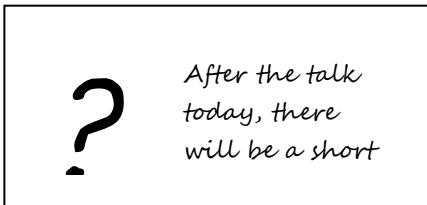
Isaiah 53:4-6

1. The need for the death of Jesus: the reality of our condition

i) words used to describe our 'sin':

transgressions

iniquities

going astray

turning to our own way

ii) words used to describe the
consequences of our sin:

griefs & sorrows

chastisement

2. The wonder of the death of Jesus: He suffers for His people

i) He is punished *for* us

ii) He is punished *because of* us
