Pay attention... (v1a) *The appeal for attention*

- therefore
- much closer attention

...lest you drift away (v1b) *The danger of drifting*

- gradual
- passive

...from salvation (v2-4) *The warning of woe*

- no hope ²
 - how shall we escape?
- no excuse
 - declared by Jesus
 - attested by witnesses
 - confirmed by God
